mandating that we change from a mandatory association to a volunteer association. Ken then introduced the Board Members. Our current status: 112 voluntary members, or about 66% of the total of 170 units. There are five homes for sale and three homes awaiting final status. Ken disclosed how he contacted all

new homeowners and

discussed the benefits of

membership.

• Dues paid: 103 out of 112.

This is about 92%. Ken is still following up with all those who have not paid. There was a discussion on how to get the rest to pay. The payment eadline was Feb. 15th.

The Board agreed that we did not want to attach a late fee for a volunteer organization. Most paid by snail mail. In addition, 18 paid by Paypal, a new system we used this year. Hopefully use of this system will grow each year.

• **Finances:** Ken then introduced

our Treasurer, Seve Cassanova, who reviewed our finances. Money in our account is now \$6,337.38. We saved some money this year by lowering our payment for insurance, since there are fewer homes in the HOA, and also lowering costs for the Rattler, since most are now going out via e-mail, thus saving on reproduction and mailing costs. Seve also reviewed the

website and the many topics included on it, i.e., all pertinent HOA documents, neighborhood referrals, relevant contact information and notices. The attendees were asked for suggestions to our page on reliable contractors. Ken

on reliable contractors. Ken thanked Seve for all his work on the website which is truly 'world class'.

- Architectural Control: Ken reviewed some of the requests we have had during the last year including outside painting of the home; adding a swimming pool; solar panel installation; landscaping a back yard and new fencing. Ken reminded the attendees that all outside architectural changes need the approval of the HOA, even those who are not voluntary members.

...from Consumer Reports, June 2013 -"Going Away? Keep burglars at Bay"

#### **Outside your home:**


- Stop your mail and newspaper or ask a friend to pick it up daily.
- Ask a trusted neighbor to park in your driveway and to come inside occasionally and change the curtain positions.
- Install motion sensor lights where a burglar can't unscrew the bulbs.
- Follow the 3/6 rule: Trim shrubs in front of the house to no higher than 3 feet from the ground and trim trees so that the lowest branches are at least six feet up.
- Don't hide a spare key anywhere that is remotely obvious **Inside the house:**

- Keep empty boxes (especially from pricey items) inside the garage until garbage day.
- Cover garage windows so that no one knows whether a car is inside.
- Lock up ladders and tools that could be used to break in.
- Leave a radio on, tuned to a talk radio station.
  - Turn down the phone ringer.
  - Put lamps on a timer.
  - Consider placing safety film over windows near door handles to make glass hard to smash.
  - Hide valuables well.
- Bolt down safes so they can't be picked up and carried out.
- Place a solid stick in slider tracks of windows and doors.
