THE PRESIDENT'S CORNER

SUMMARY OF THE ANNUAL MEETING:

ur Annual Meeting was held on April 23rd at 4400 Paseo de los Rancheros.

1. Guest Speakers: The meeting started off with two quest speakers: First was a representative of the local **Sheriff's Depart**-He spoke about what people can do to help prevent robberies and other related property crimes. Some tactics- inexpensive and quite simple- such as putting longer screws in your dead bolt, render it more difficult to force open. Other examples were provided as well. He also answered many questions from those in attendance, and distributed copies of the Pima County Sheriff's Department Neighborhood Resource Guide. Then the Fire Chief (Evening Division) of the fire station on Camino del Cerro spoke, giving us a few suggestions for preventing fires. He also passed out some smoke detectors, and indicated that anyone in this area could stop by the fire station for a free one. They also noted the new station is on the rotation for an open house which should occur not long after mid-year.

<u>2. Finance:</u> As of 4-15-12 there was \$11,899.44 in our bank ac-

count. We had a record 93% compliance rate this year for

payment of dues. (Thank You). There are five lots still owing dues for 2012, and seven lots owing dues of three years or more. We are planning on sending out final notices to those seven lots and if necessary pursue lien action if payment is not made.

3. Special Issues:

Waste Management: Ken reported that Waste Management will be continuing to adjust their fuel surcharge. We discussed a letter that received that suggested that we discontinue the garbage pickup on Thursdays. After some discussion on this issue, it was agreed that Ken would consult with Waste Management to see what the cost would be if we only had one (1) garbage pickup on Monday and one (1) recycle pickup on Monday each week, and eliminate the Thursday garbage pickup. PLEASE SEE THE SEPARATE LETTER AND VOTE ON THIS ISSUE AS IT CAN AFFECT YOUR POCKET-**BOOK.** Ken will report back on the results of the vote in the next issue of *The Rattler*. **Please Vote**- we want your voice to count as this impacts the vast majority of our Association's members.

Lighting at the Signboard: A proposal was reviewed that used the TEP Dusk to Dawn program that provides lights by the signboard that are about 14 feet tall. We, the Association, would have to provide the trenching for the underground wiring (approximately \$2,000-\$3,000) plus approximately \$21.00 per month maintenance fees. There was mixed response to this proposal,

and this project was not approved by the majority in attendance. The solar lights that are there are not too strong anymore, and the Board has some recommendations on better solar equipment which we will pursue.

Cleaning of Median Strip along Rancheros: Steilen presented a written plan to have gardeners that work at the University of Arizona come on a Saturday and Sunday from 6AM to 6PM to clear out dead plants and cactus, and cut back some live plants along the strip. They will use their own tools and equipment. A chipper will be used instead of hauling away the dead brush. The total cost is about \$3,500. The majority of the homeowners in attendance approved the plan, and the Board will review all the details at their next quarterly meeting.
