GUEST SPEAKER: SHARON BRONSON, PIMA COUNTY SUPERVISOR FOR OUR DISTRICT (District 2)

Sharon Bronson spoke for about 30 minutes regarding the County, budget situations, and other topics. After her general talk, there was a question

Responses from Sharon Bronson's office:

Good afternoon Mr. Cooper, Maria, with Supervisor Bronson's office, has been working with the Pima County Department of Transportation (PCDOT) to coordinate your requests. **1.** We have requested staff to review your request for an advance street name sign on Camino del Cerro before reaching Rancheros (going West) that indicates that the next street is Rancheros.

Road Repairs Within our Subdivision:

s you have all observed, after my contact with the County Street Repair Department, and my

providing them with a listing of 23 specific locations near the end of March, they had accomplished all of these requests by the end of April. We thanked them for the support, and for the good job they did. We plan to also make this a semi-annul event, reviewing our streets, and letting the county know of any new potholes to fill. **YOU CAN HELPI** If you notice any potholes as you drive through



the area, please contact me and I will take down the information and forward it to the County office that handles this.

Garbage and Recycle Services:

s you may note from previous articles in The Rattler, I have stated that to get the best rate from Waste Management, you should mention that another service, RAD Management, had lower rates, and you

should ask

for competive rates. Well, after a number of years, RAD has now increased their rates. I believe their new rate is \$54.00 for 3 months, which is

\$18.00 per month for a weekly pickup of one garbage and one recycle can. If you have automatic payment with Waste Management, your rate should be lower than that (at least for now).

...From one of our Residents:

ou may have noticed, on the news, that fire people are warning homeowners to maintain a (fire) safe-space around their homes. I can see that many lots are terribly overgrown. The Palo Verdes in particular tend to grow like weeds.

But fires aside, the overgrown vegetation at the edge of homeowner's lots presents another problem (especially on exterior corners),

where it makes it very difficult to see oncoming traffic when pulling out. This could be taken care of by individuals assuming the responsibility to trim the vegetation on their own lots, without the association needing

to be involved (ironically, this is a bigger problem during daylight hours; at night, at least the approaching headlamps indicate that a vehicle is near)."
