CONSTRUCTION OF 1-10/RUTHRAUFF EXCHANGE

n case you've been wondering why businesses are closing along Ruthrauff Road east of Interstate 10, here's the scoop. It's the preliminary phase of construction of the new interchange. When it's complete, waiting on trains will be a thing of the past. Actual construction is scheduled to begin late this summer or early fall and will last a little over two years. During much of that time, Ruthrauff Road and the I-10 ramps will be closed. When it's finished, Ruthrauff will feature two lanes in each direction and will be elevated above I-10, the railroad tracks and the Davis/Highway Drive intersection. OUR POT HOLES IN OUR STREETS

ast year, if you recall, the Association, through President Ken Cooper asked the street maintenance section of Pima County to repair about 24 specific locations within our neighborhood's streets, We were pleased with the County's responsiveness and with the repair work.

Ken has offered to contact them again once this rainy season comes to an end. Soon thereafter Ken and the Association's Architectural Director, Jeff Coffeen will examine street conditions, develop a list of pot holes and submit the list to the maintenance department for repair. Last year the work was accomplished in about a month, and we are hoping for the same time frame this year.
